WNYT News Channel 13 will join other NBC affiliated stations around the clock, 24-hour coverage of the XXVII Olympiad from the birthplace of the Olympics, Athens Greece. The start of the 24-hour around the clock coverage coincides with first day of the Olympics on August 11th and keeps going until the Olympics conclude August 29th. Check your local listings for information as to when specific sports are airing.

NBC will provide groundbreaking coverage of these Olympics. NBC is planning on bringing 800 plus hours of TV coverage of the 2004 Summer Olympics, which is nearly double the 441.5 hours worth of coverage they had for the Sydney Olympics in 2000, and will more than quadruple the 171.5 hours of coverage from Atlanta in 1996.

NBC will employ the use of all 5 of its broadcasting arms; the NBC network and the four cable channels MSNBC, CNBC, Bravo, and Telemundo. This will allow for unprecedented cov-

erage of every one of the 28 sports to be played in the Summer Olympics. NewsChannel 13 will carry the NBC portion of the telecast, while the four NBC cable channels will provide the additional coverage.

Perhaps the most intriguing note about NBC's coverage will be the participation of Telemundo in the Olympic coverage. Telemundo, an all Spanish-language channel, will feature the first exclusively non-English language Olympic broadcast the United States has ever seen.

Fresh off of 17 Emmy awards for its quality coverage of the Salt Lake Olympics in 2002, the quality of NBC's coverage of the 2004 Summer Games is sure to be stellar. The depth of coverage combined with the extraordinary athletic competition make the 2004 Athens Games an Olympics which undoubtably will be talked about for years to come.
